Melbourne Urban Stormwater Institutional Arrangements (MUSIA)

Rain provided Melbourne Water and all councils with a comprehensive, independently verified asset database, a powerful interactive dashboard, and clear visuals on the impacts of asset transfers, which will guide handover planning, targeted site checks, and ongoing updates. The approach sets a new benchmark for collaboration, transparency, and repeatability in the management of metro-scale drainage assets.



10-year Stormwater Management Plan – Yarra Ranges Council

Rain produced an evidence-based roadmap that ranks catchments, sets measurable targets for flood risk reduction, pollutant load cuts and blue-green infrastructure, and secures cross-agency commitments. The plan equips the Yarra Ranges Council with a governance framework that will guide investment, community education, and ecological protection through 2034.



Flood Management Framework – Frankston City Council

Rain Consulting partnered with Frankston City Council to develop a new Stormwater and Flood Management Framework. Frankston City Council faces a growing challenge in managing flood and stormwater risks due to rapid urbanisation, climate change, coastal hazards, and ageing infrastructure. SENSORS & IOT

Rain has developed an innovative approach to anticipating stormwater pipe blockages.

Machine learning and customised programming are integrated with existing pipe sensor technology to monitor the water flow behaviour in a stormwater pit over time. The resulting pit data assesses what is normal for that pit and its pipes during various flow events. Using this data, abnormal flows can be detected that may indicate a blockage is impeding water flow, and potentially causing costly damages and repairs.

Staying ready between storms

This tool enables councils to prioritise stormwater pit inspections and remedial repairs before weather events. Rather than being reactive to storm events and flooded pits, an inspection schedule can proactively maintain problematic pipes in a catchment, both individually and collectively. The result is a reduction in risk, labour, materials and time.

Facilitating smarter risk assessments

The tool is GIS and web-based, and can be used to complete Risk Assessments outside flood models for Critical Infrastructure, such as Substations, Hospitals, and Transport Hubs. The tool can be configured to fit seamlessly within flood models as required.

Focus Areas

Ranking Pipe Blockage Risk

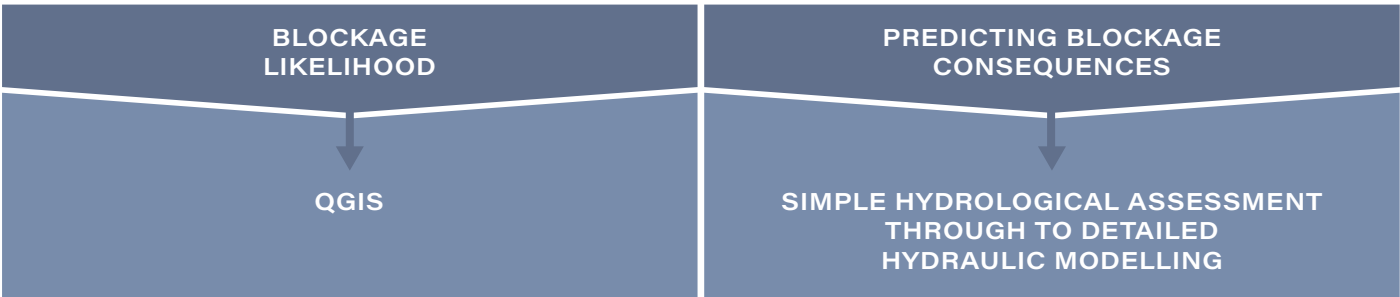
An Innovative Methodology for Flood Resilience and Efficient Maintenance.

Rain's Pipe Blockage Assessment Tool calculates the likelihood of a blockage and predicts its consequences to facilitate proactive maintenance. Using an innovative QGIS Approach, flood models are not specifically required to rank pipe blockage potential, providing impact across large catchments.

Use Cases Include:

- Storm Preparation: Pre-flood maintenance to identify the top 10–20 pipes most likely to block.

- Maintenance Planning: Focus cleaning on high-likelihood, high-consequence areas.
- Budget Allocation: Justify investment in maintenance based on risk, not just routine.
- Verification: Compare tool outputs with known problem spots or flood model results to refine cleaning schedules.
- Funding: Critical Infrastructure Protection may open new sources of funding.

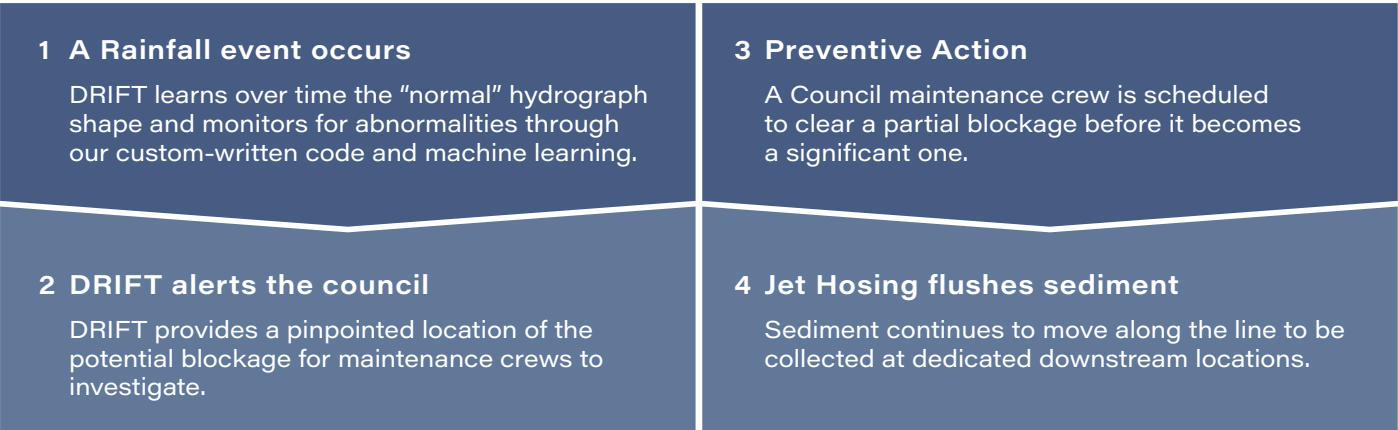


DRIFT –

Drainage Risk & Impact Forecasting Tool

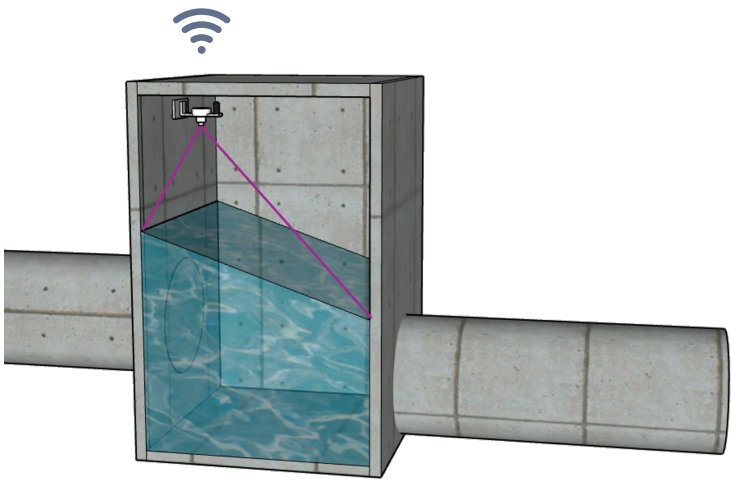
Rain's DRIFT Sensor Program monitors and learns over time. The tool assesses the normal pass-through of a flow event to identify blockages not only at pits but also between them.

A Typical Flow Event Scenario:



Additional monitoring opportunities:

- When tied to weather stations or radar, abnormal flows can help detect illegal connections and pollution events.
- In larger events where flooding occurs, DRIFT can determine whether the pipe network is operating to its full potential.
- DRIFT reporting can help identify system improvements and be useful for councils involved in litigation with homeowners, business owners, or authorities.



THINKING IN ACTION

Elizabeth Street Catchment, Melbourne CBD

Rain Consulting was engaged to deliver a Hybrid Flood Management Plan for the Elizabeth Street Catchment that included a Blockage Likelihood and Consequence Tool Development Trial funded by Melbourne Water.

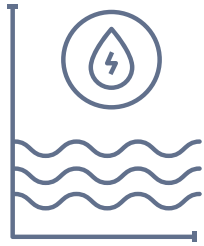
Rain utilised a GIS-based tool with built-in QGIS to identify and assess pipes within and outside probable flood paths to determine the probability of blockage. A resulting **Blockage Likelihood Score** combines physical and environmental risk factors with inputs based on expert logic and available data.

A series of TUFLOW simulations was undertaken at rainfall intensities of 1%, 5%, and 20% AEP (Annual Exceedance Probability), with a storm duration of 1 hour.

The trial recommends using the QGIS blockage likelihood tool bi-monthly in high-risk pipes before forecast storms to record outcomes after each cleaning. This will allow council teams to target maintenance where it matters most.

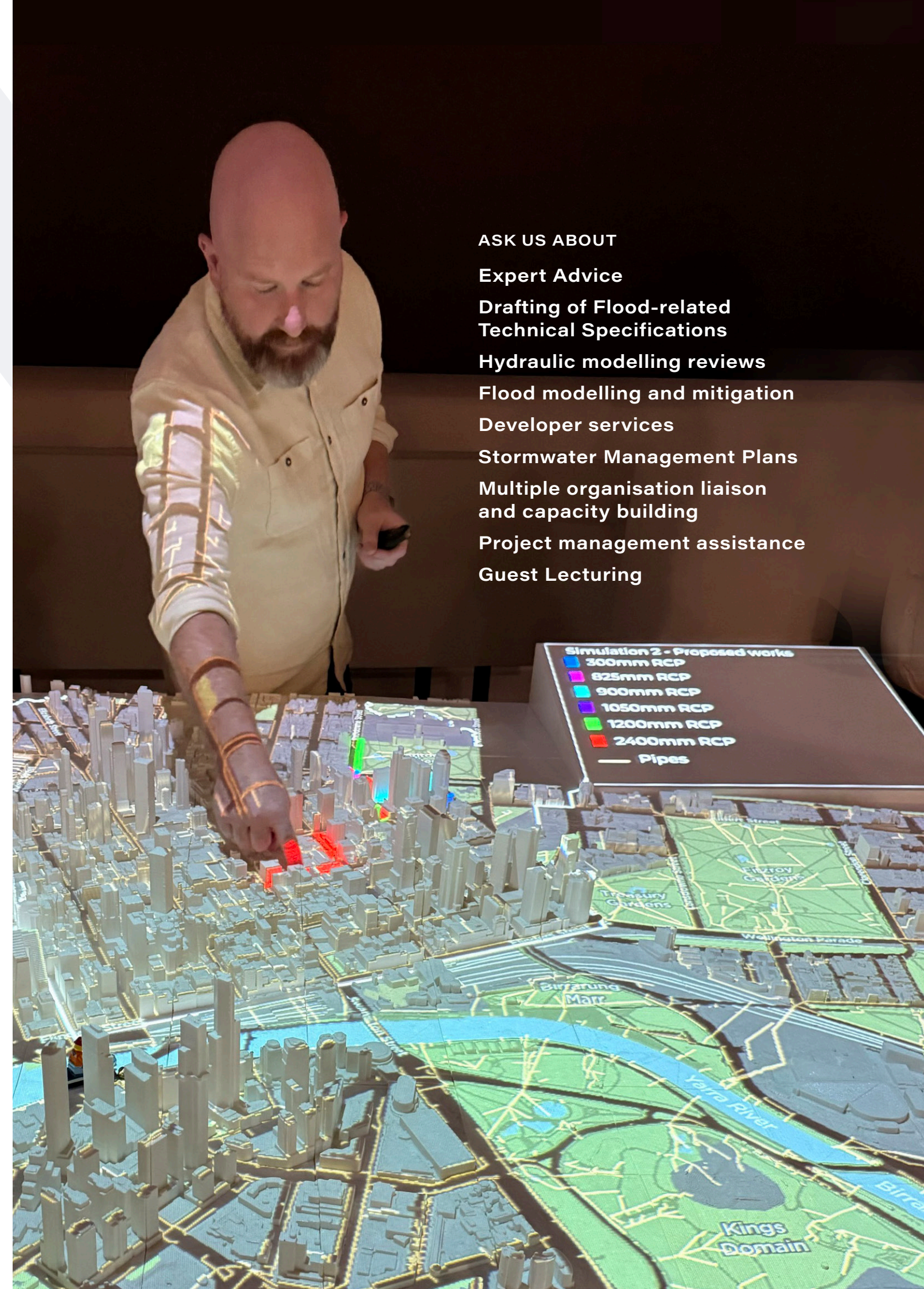

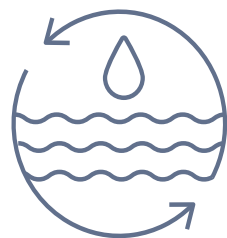

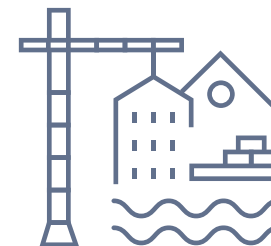

Rainfall Erosion Analysis
– WA Mine Site

Rain Consulting was engaged to assess the design and performance of a proposed sump, located at a mine site in the Wheatbelt region of Western Australia.

The project aimed to prevent erosion and runoff issues that had impacted the site in past years, supporting mine compliance and site safety. The requirement was to design and verify a sump that would provide enough capacity and resilience in future major storm events, especially considering the erodible sand and fines at the site.

The assessment utilised industry-standard RORB and TUFLOW modelling to test whether the sump could safely manage rainfall from a major storm (2% AEP, or a 1-in-50-year event). Rain confirmed the proposed sump has ample capacity after a major event. Flows across the nearby Brand Highway are reduced by over 80% compared to pre-mine conditions, significantly decreasing downstream flood risk.
